Comprehensive Violence + Abuse Prevention Training



Our annual Comprehensive Violence and Abuse Prevention Training provides approximately 30-hours of education, skills building, and connection for preventionists across the state to help us better stop violence from ever happening in the first place.

This training takes place in-person and virtually, rotating every other year to support statewide access, with 60-100 people participating each year. Since its launch in 2018, we have trained over 380 individuals from over 200 different organizations in all 36 counties in Oregon, and have provided the training to other states upon request, as well.

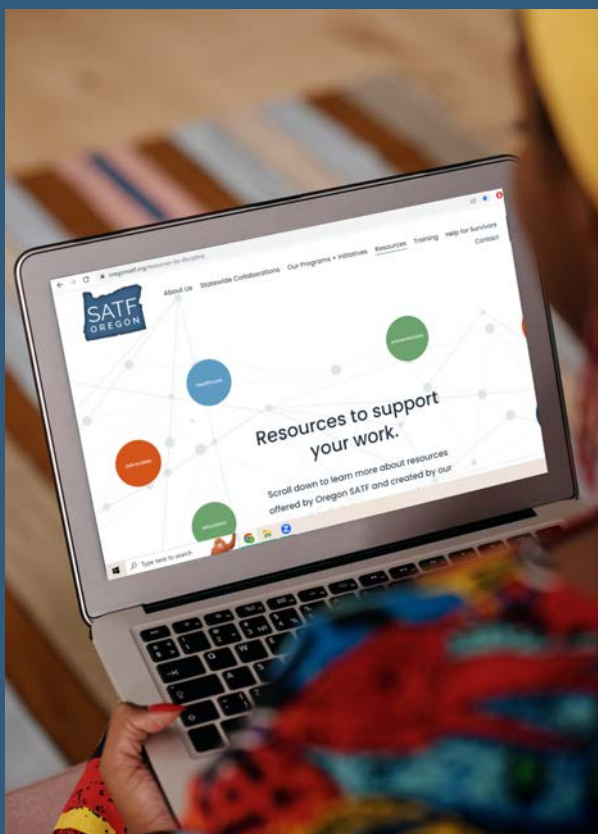

Tier 2 supports approximately 30 hours of specialized, one-on-one technical assistance support provided to our online learners from our staff who are content experts and curriculum developers.

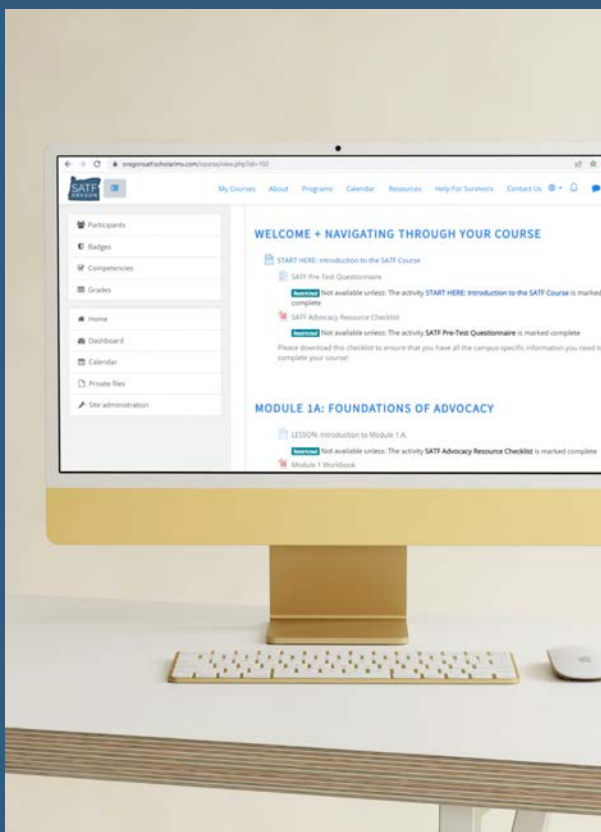
Tier 3 supports the annual cost of our specialized course creation platform that offers an interactive and seamless learning experience for participants.

Campus-Based Advocate Certification



One of our most requested trainings is our Campus-Based Advocate Certification course. Oregon SATF is the only provider of a campus-specific 40-hour training that meets state standards for advocate certification in the state.

This virtual course is paired with individual support and assistance from our Campus Team who are available to answer questions, talk through scenarios, and ensure that learners get a well-rounded learning experience.
